

Paul. In and of ourselves, through mere human means, perfection is impossible. With Christ, it is not only possible, its price has already been paid. Many erroneously conclude from such observations, "Ah, Hah. I can't be perfect. God makes me perfect and I have no role." False.

Read of Paul's determination and thereby observe man's responsibility to reach God's plan for the perfection of His people in *Philippians 3:7-16*. Especially note *verse 12*, "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own" and *verse 14*, "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

"Press" in both texts is the Greek *dioko*. It makes other appearances in the NT that relate man's role in the pursuit of perfection in Christ. "Strive... for holiness without which no one will see the Lord," *Hebrews 12:14*. "Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love steadfastness, gentleness," *1 Timothy 6:11*. The apostle urges his readers in these same pursuits using

his own life as an example as he seeks to "live out his own salvation" with the energizing forces of "rever-

"Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own..." 13. Paul knew that "apathy is the death knell of any order," and that it must be defeated in the life of every Christian. He offers his own three prong prescription to living life going forward in pursuit of perfection: "This one thing I do...."

Forgetting what lies behind — Living in the past is a symptom of apathy. "I remember when" is its lyric. Paul happily laid his illustrious history of human triumph upon the trash heap of the past, and called the Philippians to do the same.

Straining forward to what lies ahead — Here Paul uses *epekteinomai* to describe the action of stretching forward. Work remains. New opportunities are in the future. Paul wrote, "I keep reaching for what lies ahead."

I press on toward the goal — God does not promise his treasures to apathetic people. Paul did not run aimlessly. He lives with spiritual goals in view and controls his passions for the sake of those goals, 14. He calls us to follow him in the effort. Don't go backward. Press on! This is the "mature" way of thinking.

Practicing What We Know

"What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you."

Philippians 4:9

n Philippians 4:9 Paul implored, "What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you." Students should carefully examine the greater context for explanation of Paul's exhortation.

CHAPTER 1 — Paul preached in spite of hardship, trial and incarceration. God blessed his efforts and the cause of Christ was advanced, 1:12-18. The apostle pled, "let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ," 1:27.

CHAPTER 2 — Paul pointed to Jesus, who "emptied himself" to bring about human redemption, 2:1-11. The apostle intreated, "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling... that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish... shine as light in the world," 2:12-18.

CHAPTER 2 — Paul offered real world illustrations of men, Timothy and Epaphroditus, who sacrificed life and limb to make the gospel available to them, 2:19-30. He then pled, "receive him (Epaphroditus) in the Lord with all joy, and honor such men, for he nearly died for the work of Christ," 2:29-30.

CHAPTER 3 — Paul reminded the Philippians that like Jesus had emptied Himself of divine prerogatives, he divested himself of every fleshly claim — "whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ... that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead," *3:2-11*. Now he could confi-

dently say, "Follow me as I follow Jesus."

CHAPTER 4 — Paul begins, "Stand firm thus in the Lord," 4:1. Pursue spiritual minds that think the way God and His Son thinks, 4:8. Then he comes to verse 9. It encapsulates the essence of discipleship and spiritual growth. It underscores the importance of not only acquiring knowledge (learn) but taking it to heart (receive). Paul does not simply encourage passive absorption of teachings (hearing and seeing) but emphasizes active implementation (practice).

"Practice these things" resonates deeply in the hearts of those who seek to follow Christ. It beckons us to embody the principles of excellence, humility, and sacrifice that Jesus exemplified in his earthly ministry. It challenges us to translate our faith into action, allowing it to permeate every aspect of our existence and service in the name of Christ.

Paul assures believers of the presence of the "God of peace" when they walk in obedience — practice what we know. This promised fellowship underscores the transformative power of living out the teachings of Christ. He reminds us that true peace, the peace that surpasses understanding, is found in the intimate fellowship with God cultivated through a life of obedience and faithfulness. We can be confident in the assurance that as we live out our faith, the God of peace walks alongside us, guiding, sustaining, and blessing our journey.
